Mthatha Mission Trip

This month, I will have the opportunity to go to Mthatha as part of a Donegal Presbytery delegation celebrating the opening of a computer lab partially funded by our presbytery. The lab will offer critical computer skills training that will help young people with employment and career progress. I am also looking forward to meeting members of our own sister congregation, the Khulani church. Lisa will be accompanying me on this trip.

Following the computer dedication, we will be leaving the rest of the delegation and visiting a mission school on the Mthatha coast to scout out a future partnership with St. Andrew's School in

Delaware. Then, after a few days in Cape Town, we will return to Johannesburg where I will meet with students and faculty of the University of Pretoria School of Theology to discuss the uniqueness of South African theology and how it compares to our familiar (European) Reformed Theology. I am particularly interested in learning more about how theology informs and affects their daily walk of faith. When I return home, I will be preparing a study program to share what I have learned. I am truly blessed with this chance to learn and grow in my own faith.

While I am away, Steve Doutrich will cover for me with any pastoral issues that arise (hopefully, there will be none!). I appreciate his presence here at OPC.

SYMBOLOLOGY

Why We Do What We Do When We Do It

You might not realize it, but there is method to the madness of our worship order. We break the service up into four main sections with specific actions in each one. Here is a brief explanation:

WE GATHER IN GOD'S NAME – We begin our worship in a spirit of praise (hymns and songs), embracing our common lives together (announcements, mission moments) and acknowledging our great need for God's saving grace (confession cycle – always ending with an assurance that we are never beyond Christ's saving love). Then we share Christ's Peace to reconcile with each other and unite us as we prepare for God's Word.

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD PROCLAIMED – Next we ask for the Holy Spirit to open our hearts as we listen to the scripture readings for the day (Prayer for Illumination). The interpretation of that scripture comes in several forms: the Children's Message, the sermon, dramatic

reading, music, etc. (the sermon is the most common).

WE RESPOND TO GOD'S WORD – After allowing God to speak to us through the scriptures, we respond by affirming our faith, celebrating the sacraments (Baptism or Communion), praying for each other and the world, and giving our offerings to support God's work in the church.

WE GO OUT TO SERVE – the final hymn and the charge and benediction send us out into the world, hopefully prepared by the worship experience, to share God's love.

Through these four movements, worship reflects our faith journeys, responding to Christ's call to discipleship. It is theologically different from the worship sequence of most of the 20th Century where everything in worship led up to the sermon, which was the climax of all that came before. The modern order draws on the power of the community living in the Word of God. In worship we celebrate the symbolism of the intertwining elements of our journey of faith: koinonia – community, doxology – praise, and mission.

2012 Thank Offering

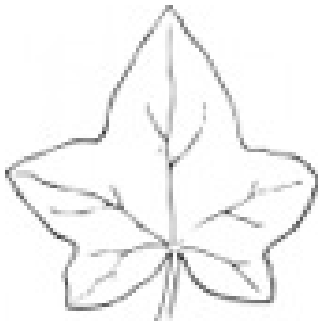
The 2012 Thank Offering will be received Sunday, November 11.

The Thank Offering is one of two yearly offerings sponsored by Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church USA. The Birthday Offering is received in the spring.

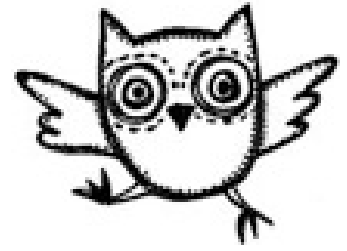
Each of these offerings has had an immeasurable impact on the missionary movement in the church. This offering is an important part of PW's Celebration Giving program.

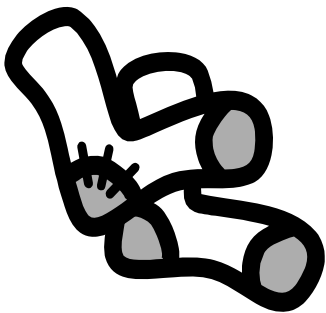

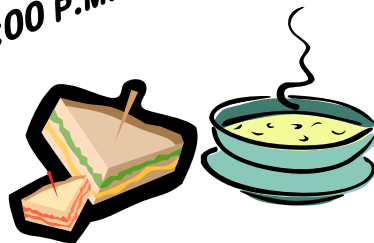
